Early Life

Roger Nicholas Hedley Thomas was the son of Gordon David Thomas and Mary Lavender Greenhough.

He was born in 1950 in a nursing home at 116 Harborne Road, Quinton, Birmingham at 3.30 p.m., weighing in at 9 lbs., and then returned to his parents' home at 491 Hagley Road West, Quinton, Birmingham. *See Birth Certificate in Appendix.*

He was christened on 4th June 1950 at St Peter's Church, Harborne, Birmingham.

Roger went to Chigwell House School at 5, Highfield Road, Edgbaston, Birmingham between 1955 and 1961.

He then went to King Edwards Five Ways Grammar School in Scotland Lane, Bartley Green, Birmingham between 1961 and 1967.

SCHOOL PHOTOS

Roger enjoyed Mathematics at school. He successfully took 3 'O' levels one year early, ended up with 5 'O' levels altogether in Mathematics, English, French, Physics and Geography. He joined the Sixth Form studying Mathematics, Further Mathematics and Physics. He took the Mathematics (Pure Mathematics & Theoretical Mechanics) 'A' level one year early and passed with a grade 'E'. He then found the subjects were getting progressively harder, and decided that getting a job was the best option.

Employment History

Roger is now retired, and was a Project Manager in Computer Systems.

In 1967, he started work at GEC Magnet Computer Bureau in Electric Avenue, Witton, Birmingham as a trainee Computer Operator. The company was situated in the main GEC Works Administration Block.

He worked in the Operations Department for about 3 years, and in 1969 he graduated to become a Shift Leader responsible for a team of Computer Operators.

The company had Honeywell mainframe computers. The first one was a Honeywell 800 and it filled a large room! This would have had less power than a pc today! They then added a Honeywell 200 computer, which was used for small processing and to carry out the printing in an off-line manner.

Later a Honeywell 1250 was installed, and was used to run the whole bureau service for the GEC customers. To give an idea of its size and power, it had all of 64 KB of memory, and the disc drives which were about a half metre in diameter with 6 discs vertically had about the same capacity as a floppy disc!

Roger was working a 3-shift system, days, evenings and nights. It was difficult to acclimatise to the change in working hours, but he enjoyed the night shift, with the eeriness of the whole works being empty and traveling back home in the early hours of the morning. He was often stopped by the police who wondered what he was doing out at that time of night in a red Morgan sports car!

Roger started to teach himself programming whilst he was a Computer Operator, working in direct machine language, and later in assembler languages such as ARGOS.

In 1970, Roger moved out of Operations into Computer Programming and Systems Analysis, using the COBOL programming language. He designed the main Project Costing and Financial Accounting system used by the then GEC-Marconi, a system called MARCAS (MARconi Computerised Accounting System). This computer system was in operation from the early 1980's until around 2005.

In 1978, he became Project Leader and by 1987 he became Project Manager responsible for the development, support and maintenance of this system.

It was at GEC Magnet Computer Bureau that Roger met his wife to be Margaret Cundall, who was working with GEC as a programmer. She was living at the time in a flat on the Chester Road, Birmingham, and later moved to a small 3 storey block of flats at Brookvale Court, Erdington.

The company went through many name changes and locations:

- GEC Magnet Computer Bureau became Midland Computer Services Ltd
- Later it merged with a computer centre at Stafford to became GEC Computer Services Ltd
- Roger moved from Witton to Tamebridge near Walsall and later to their head office in Stafford
- The company was then merged into EASAMS, which was part of the GEC Marconi Group
- In 2000, EASAMS was split into two Marconi Software Solutions and EASAMS
- Later the EASAMS part of the company was bought by the Birmingham based company, ITNET
- In 2005, ITNET were bought by Serco
- Roger retired from Serco in 2007

Roger became interested in family history research in November 1997 when he and his brother Mike started to try to expand the initial documentation that had been produced, mainly from memory, by their father, Gordon.

The Morgan Plus 4 4-Seater

I bought my Morgan Plus 4 4-seater in June 1970 from Mr Miles at Phoenix Motors, The Green, Woodbury, Exeter, Devon EX5 1LT.

In July 2006 I decided to try to investigate and document the history of the car as best that I could.

I wrote to Phoenix Motors asking if they had any details of my purchase 36 years ago. I wasn't very hopeful that they might still have records dating back to that time, but if they did, whether they had any details about the car up to my purchase in 1970, such as:

- its year of manufacture
- the previous owner(s)
- the specification (TR2 or TR3 engine?)
- the original colour (it was resprayed for me in a deep red as part of the rebuild)
- anything else about the car

I later wrote to Roger Stokes at the local history website for the Woodbury area near Exeter.


This story is documented in their September 2006 newsletter attached below.

I sold the car many years ago when I got married (as many people find it necessary to do so). I now wish that I had recorded more details at the time about the car and its specification.

Morgan no longer produces a 4 seater model, and manufacture of 4 seaters ceased in 2016.

Phoenix Motors, previously Berry's Garage as it was in the 1970's. Now of course very different! For most of the last 40 years it was the Morgan car agency for the South West. From this humble building Morgan's were sold new, rebuilt, and you might have had to wait years to get one. Alf (Buster) Miles' team were experts in their field and took great pride in all their output. It is rumoured that in the dead of night, if you walk past the Green, the "roar" of a Morgan can still be heard along with Ted Berry hammering on his anvil! (See further story inside).

HE HIT THE JACKPOT USING THE POWER OF THE INTERNET!

The Woodbury website, which has now had over 14000 hits, is used to getting requests from people all over the world trying to trace their family roots. However during August something completely different arrived in an e-mail to Roger Stokes, the website editor. *Can you find a picture of Phoenix Motors as it was in the 1970's?* This lead to an amazing sequence of events as related below by Roger Thomas the original e-mail writer.

I had seen a car (a Morgan +4 4 seater built in the late 1950s) advertised at Phoenix Motors in 1970 and travelled down from Birmingham to look at it. At the time it was dirty, dusty, rusting and in pieces in the back of the garage. I said straight away that I'd have it, subject to its restoration (being an impulsive 20 year old at the time).

The next time that I saw the car was when I picked it up. The car had been rebuilt and resprayed, gleamed, and was totally transformed. I couldn't believe how good it looked, and was very eager to get behind the wheel, which is probably why I can't recall the photo being taken.

This summer, I had decided to try and document a small history of the car, as this car was very special to me. So I wrote to Phoenix Motors in July 2006 asking if they had any records of my car still. I had a reply from Mr Miles's daughter, Rosemary, saying that her mother had died last year, and that she had cleared out all her effects, including all the paperwork covering 40 years of supplying Morgan cars.

I thought "just my luck" that it had all be thrown away so recently when I was looking for records of 36 years ago.

So, when I went on holiday to Cornwall in August this year (2006), I decided to call in at Woodbury, to try to find Phoenix Motors Garage to see if it brought back memories and to photograph where my car had come from. I couldn't find the garage anywhere, and called in at another garage to ask if they knew where it was. They said it had been pulled down about 6 years ago, and some houses had been built on the site. Rosemary hadn't mentioned that the Garage had been demolished, but I hadn't asked the question anyway.

I thought "just my luck" again, 6 years too late.

It then occurred to me that the postman had done a good job delivering my letter to Mr Miles's daughter considering I addressed the letter just to Phoenix Motors, which had been demolished 6 years earlier. Full marks to the Postman. When I returned from holiday, I searched the internet to see if there were any old pictures of Woodbury which may include the garage, as I knew there is a local history website for my local village of Harborne that has old photos of my village. I found the website for Woodbury maintained by Roger, but there were no photos of the garage.

I thought "just my luck" yet again.

So, just by chance, I thought I would email him, asking if he had any old photographs of the garage, and he emailed me back with 5 photos but they were all of the demolishment of the garage (one of them being the final pile of bricks!) and a further photograph of the garage before it was Phoenix Motors.

These photos were very interesting (thanks) but I had to admit that I had that feeling of "just my luck" again, as it seemed so close to what I had hoped to find, but so far away.

Roger then said that he was in contact with Mr Miles's daughter, and would ask if she had any photos. About 4 weeks later, he emailed me to say that he had received about 50 photos from her, and asked my car registration, which I gave him (358 FNP). He then emailed me back saying


that it looked like I had hit the jackpot, and assumed that the bloke in one of the photos was me. I don't remember the photos being taken, but well, it was 36 years ago!! I thought what a fantastic find, and what an amazing long shot it all was. I couldn't get over the excitement, as I loved that car, and only had a couple of photos of it. I looked slim compared to now (and I have to admit, a bit weird) but it was 1970, and I was aged 20!

I then thought "just my very very good luck" at last!!

After all this, I had definitely hit the jackpot, mainly due to Roger, Rosemary and the Postie's help. I still can't get over how successful the outcome was, and get quite emotional when relating it to others. Unfortunately, I don't have the car anymore, and I'm still trying to find its whereabouts and whether it still exists, as the car has so many fond memories, but our recent success spurs me on!"

As the writer was only really after a photo of the garage, which may have been an easy task to come up with, a picture of him *and* his car after 36 years carries considerably more odds to say the least (and in colour too!). Of the 50 photos, his was the only one with the customer in. However, please be aware that we can't work miracles all the time, unless someone knows where the car is now! If you happen to see it please let us know.




